

Nominating Committee Report to the 221st Diocesan Convention

A. Standing Committee (Vote by Orders)

1 Clergy Member, 4-year term

The Rev. Arthur P. Powell – St. James' Church, Yardville

Arthur Powell, rector of St. James' in Yardville, worked in establishing this congregation's ministry in Yardville. He has served as a priest of the diocese for 20 years. He serves on the Congregational Development Committee of the diocese, is chaplain to the Diocesan Altar Guild, and is the Dean of the Trenton Convocation. Among areas of service to the diocese, Fr. Powell has served on the Diocesan Council and the Episcopal Election Committee.

The Rev. Dr. Patrick R. Close – Grace Church, Haddonfield

Patrick Close considers it a privilege to serve the diocese and work with the Bishop. He brings experience from serving on the Commission of Ministry and other committees in the diocese.

The Rev. Douglas A. Freer – St. James' Church, Long Branch

Christened and confirmed in Port-of-Spain, Trinidad, Noreen Duncan is a vestry member at Trinity, Princeton and serves as a lay chalice bearer, reader and usher. She is co-chair and teaching member of the Anti--Racism Team. Other service to the diocese includes the Major Chapter of Trinity Cathedral, Clerical Compensation Commission, member on the Board of Trinity Cathedral Academy and Friend of the Cathedral.

The Rev. Canon Servio R. Moscoso – San José Church, Elizabeth

4 Clergy Alternates, 3-year terms

The Rev. Philip B. Carr-Jones – Church of the Holy Spirit, Lebanon

Philip Carr-Jones serves on the Standing Committee, Insurance Committee, ECVA, Companion Diocese, and Liturgy and Music Commissions. He has served on the Clerical Compensation Committee and several task forces over the years. He claims that the memory grows dim, but not the commitment nor the enthusiasm for the mission.

The Rev. Paul A. Van Sant – Church of the Good Shepherd, Berlin
