**Sub-committee reports:**

**Adult education:**

Emily Griffin reported on Equipping the Servants conference to be held in October. The deadline for workshop descriptions is June 1. There are 40 slots for workshops and forms for the workshop descriptions are available to those who are presenters from the Committee on Christian Formation.

Our Christian Educator's Day with Our Bishop is set for Jan. 19 with both the Bishop's calendar and the Cathedral. Mike Redpath has volunteered to be the coordinator for this day. Johann Eppley-Schmidt was suggested for our keynote speaker. The theme of the day would be storytelling for all ages.
